A Legacy of Excellence: From Tuning Initiatives to AUN-QEx



Tuning TA-SE Project

The Tuning Academy, founded by the University of Deusto and the University of Groningen, promotes student-centered, competence-based curriculum reform through its internationally recognized methodology. The Tuning Asia-South East (TA-SE) Project applied this approach in ASEAN, co-funded by Erasmus+, engaging 23 universities to develop regional reference points and redesign curricula in Medicine, Civil Engineering, and Teacher Education.

CALOHEA Project

Building on the foundations laid by the TA-SE Project, the CALOHEA Project was launched to further enhance recognition of learning outcomes and qualifications across Southeast Asian universities. Funded by Erasmus+ and guided by the Tuning Academy and the ASEAN University Network, CALOHEA focuses on developing tools for assessing, comparing, and improving student achievement in key subject areas. Through widespread regional engagement, CALOHEA's Recognition Mechanisms have successfully expanded awareness to over 3,000 participants from 348 universities/institutions in 22 countries across 14 National Meetings.





AUN-Qualifications Excellence (AUN-QEx) Initiative

The ASEAN University Network – Qualifications Excellence (AUN-QEx) is to continue the spirit of TA-SE and CALOHEA Project, dedicated to supporting higher education institutions across the ASEAN region in enhancing the quality and global competitiveness of their degree programmes.
